# Guide to qualifications

#### **Build your own pathway**


We deliver a range of programmes from SCQF level 1 to 12, comprising courses for school pupils in their senior phase and college programmes through to apprenticeships and university-level study. Our programmes are designed so you can create your own unique learner journey. You get credit for prior learning and experience and enter at the SCQF level that is right for you. We provide pathways so you can progress seamlessly through the SCQF levels and then, when the time is right for you, you can exit with the qualification you want. This means you choose your own path.

#### SCQF levels and qualifications explained

We use the Scottish Credit and Qualifications Framework to explain the level of difficulty of a programme – SCQF level 1 being the equivalent of a National 1 in Scotland and SCQF level 12 a Doctoral Degree.

You can check the entry requirements for courses on our website to identify which level to apply for based on your prior learning and experience. Our student support team can also advise you if you are unsure. Towards the end of your course, you will be given the option to exit with a qualification or progress on to the next SCQF level of study.

#### **Admissions policy**

- By 30th April for applications submitted up to 28th February

- By 18th July for applications submitted up to 31st May


#### **Library services**

Our learning resource centre provides access to PCs and printers along with breakout spaces for group discussion. A laptop lending service is also available.




Motor Vehicle progression route

## Fees & Funding

The Student Funding Team are here to offer you advice and assistance on any aspect of student support funding which includes Bursary, Education Maintenance Allowance, Childcare and Discretionary Funding.

#### **Funding**

These funds help to support you financially while studying at UHI Inverness, and can include living costs, travel, course materials and childcare. What you receive will depend on eligibility, including:

- Where you live, i.e. your nationality and residency status and how long you have resided in the UK and/ or Scotland.
- + Your course, e.g. whether your course is above or below HNC level, or, full or part-time.
- + Your age at the start of your course different levels of support are applicable subject to age.
- Your personal circumstances, e.g. your income or spouse/parents' income, marital status, number of dependents, whether you are care experienced, etc.
- + Whether you have received student funding before.

If studying a further education course (SCQF level 1-6), students need to apply for funding through UHI Inverness. You will only be able to do this after you have accepted an unconditional offer. At this point, you will be sent information on how to access our Student Hub to apply for funding.

Students studying higher education programmes (SCQF level 7 to 12) should apply for funding to the Student Awards Agency for Scotland www.saas.gov.uk.

#### Fees

The fees you pay will depend on the level of course you are studying. There are many ways in which you can fund your course fees.


If you are studying on a full-time further education programme (SCQF level 1 to 6) and you meet the residency criteria, fees are waived. If you are studying a part-time further eduction programme, your fees may be waived if you receive certain state benefit.

If you are studying a full-time higher eduction programme (SCQF 7 to 12) and you live in Scotland, you can apply to SAAS to help cover your fees. SAAS can also support students studying part-time higher education programmes. The fee you pay is dependent on your residency status, previous higher education undertaken, course being studied and your personal circumstances.
