Once you receive a conditional or unconditional offer, it is important you accept your place. You can do this either by text or email.

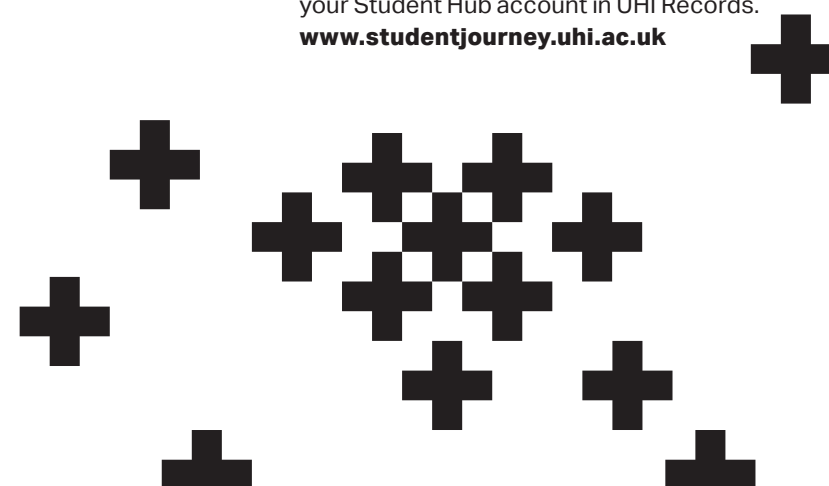

- + Please reply OFFER followed by a space (this is essential) then your name, applicant number, course code and the words 'accept' or 'decline.'

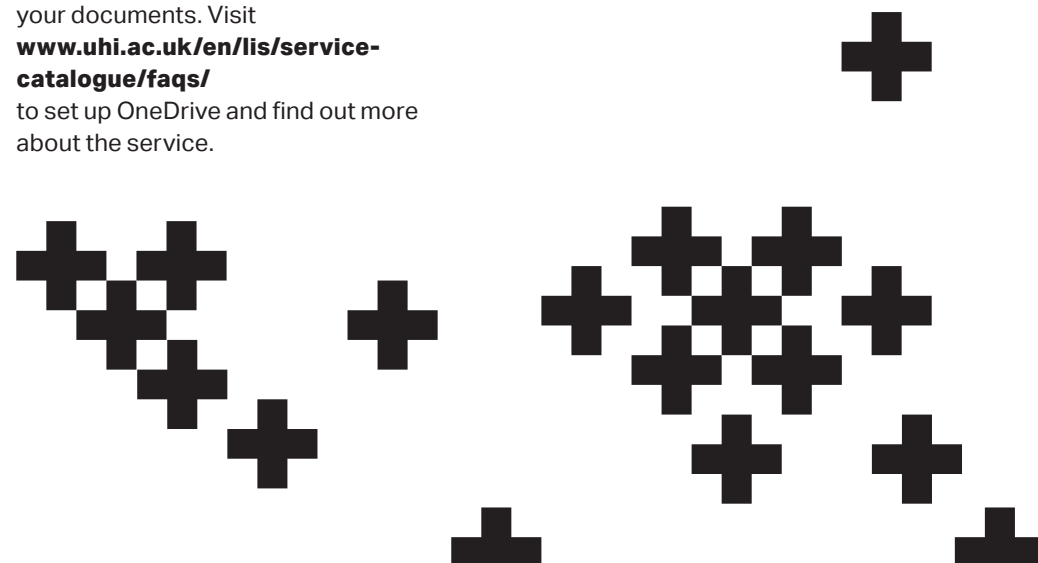

## Before you arrive

### Apply for a bus pass

Anyone under the age of 22 will need to apply for a National Entitlement Card (NEC) or Young Scot National Entitlement Card (Young Scot NEC) if they have not already got one, in order to access free bus travel. Apply online at [getyournec.scot](http://getyournec.scot). If you cannot apply online, you can apply in person at your local council office. Please allow up to ten working days from the date your application was approved for your card to arrive.

### Apply for funding

If you are studying a further education course, (SCQF levels 1 to 6), we will send you information on how to apply for student funding once you have an unconditional offer and have firmly accepted your place. **Funding applications open in July** and must be made online, each year, and requires all documentary evidence requested to be provided before your application can be assessed.

Higher education students (SCQF 7 to 10) should apply for SAAS funding. SAAS funding **opens in April** and you must apply every year for your funding. SAAS aims to have your funding in place at the start of your programme, for all correctly completed applications received before 30th June.

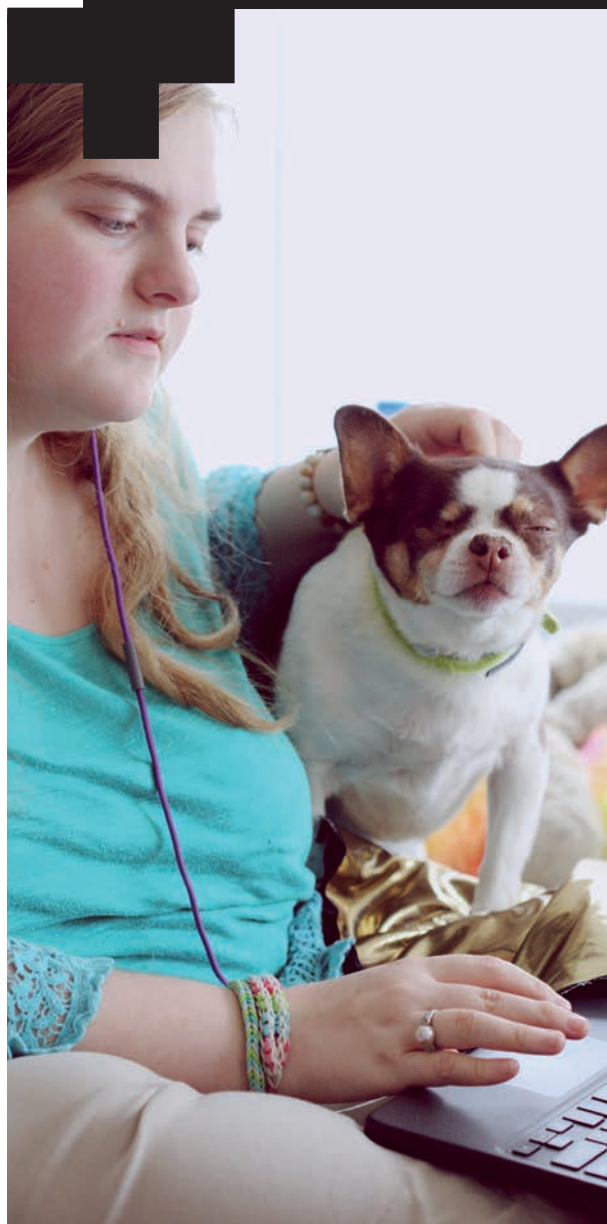

### Enrol online

Online enrolment **opens in July** each year. Log into your Student account **[www.studentjourney.uhi.ac.uk](http://www.studentjourney.uhi.ac.uk)**

Select the course option and go into your To Do List.

Once you are enrolled you will have access to IT systems, facilities and resources.

For all higher education students, we will inform SAAS once you have enrolled and had your attendance confirmed. SAAS will then release funds into your designated bank account.

For degree level students, select your units/modules for the following academic year. Some HNC/D students must also use their student account to select units/modules each year.

**After enrolment, we will send all communication to your student email address, so it is important that you regularly check your student mailbox.**

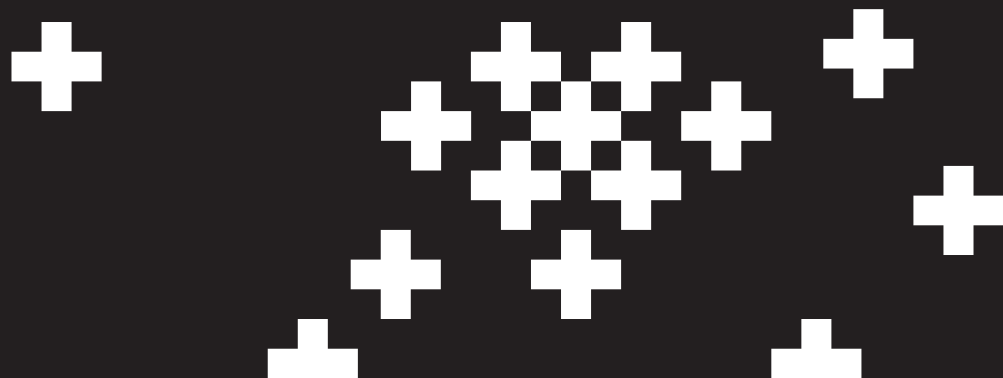

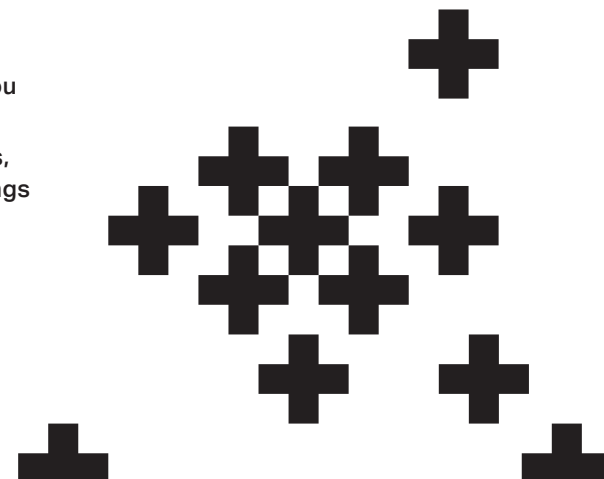
- + A welcome by your lecturing team and further information about your course including your course handbook and timetable.
- + An introduction to your Personal Development Advisor (PDA) or Personal Academic Tutor (PAT), depending on your level of study. Your PDA/PAT can signpost students to all support services during induction period and throughout the year, including funding, health, wellbeing, careers, study guidance and additional support for learning.
- + You will also receive an introduction to The Bothy, our one-stop shop for all the wider student support services which are there to help you during your time with us.
- + An introduction to our ICT systems, learning platforms, campus buildings and facilities including our Library and Learning Resource Centre.
- + An introduction to our students' association - HISA.

Freshers' Fayre normally takes place mid-September and is a great opportunity to meet new friends and learn more about clubs and societies on campus. Our Student Support Team will also be able to help you prepare for your future career. ## Assessments/Assignments

Your course tutor will give you an assessment schedule when you begin your course. Speak to your lecturer in the first instance to gain help preparing for your assessment and look on Brightspace for help with meeting your assessment brief.

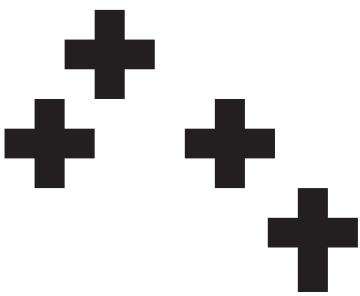

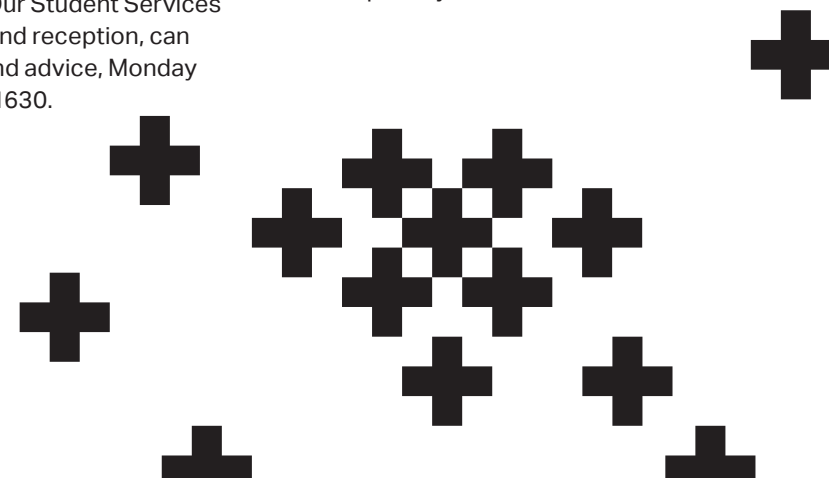
## Harassment

## The Universities and Colleges Admissions Service (UCAS)

Anyone who wants to study an undergraduate degree in the UK needs to apply through UCAS.

The process itself is reasonably straightforward but much of the content requires considerable preparation before submission.

For most universities and courses, the deadline is late January each year.

When making an application through UCAS, you can apply for a maximum of five courses in any one year. This can be five versions of the same course at five different universities, or five different courses all at the same university or any combination thereof. You can only accept one offer, your 'Firm Acceptance', and a second choice backup, an 'Insurance Acceptance'. You will need to turn down all other offers.

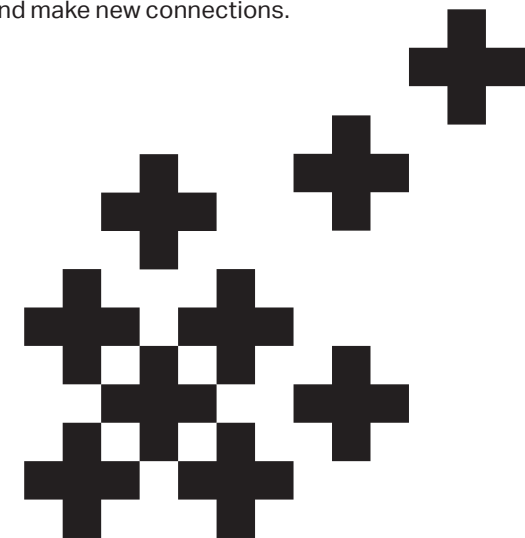
